Dear Mr. Koussa:

Thank you for your letter of December 18th. I found your comment on Shereshevsky's article and your analysis of the Arab-Israeli situation of great interest. I think it is the profoundest thing I have read on the situation in recent months, and I shall be very pleased to publish it in a forthcoming issue of the Jewish Newsletter. Unfortunately it will probably have to wait a few weeks because of the rush of current events and the many articles on the subject which we must publish before yours. Under separate cover I am sending you by airmail this and last week's issues of the JN, containing articles on the subject by other people.

With reference to the first three paragraphs of your letter, I was shocked by the facts you revealed, but I take it for granted that you do not want these facts published because it might hurt your position still more. I wonder, however, whether you can suggest something that we can do to help you. I shall be glad to follow any suggestion that would come from you.
