Eshkol trusts Arabs' desire to integrate

"The Government of Israel has no doubt that the State's Arab and Druse citizens want, with all their heart, to become fully integrated into the life of the country," Prime Minister Eshkol declared last night.

"Yet there is a minority which seeks to sow discord and cause trouble. The Government will continue to strive to isolate this destructive minority," he added.

Mr. Eshkol was speaking at a luncheon at Beit Elisheva in Jerusalem honouring the outgoing Adviser on Arab Affairs, Mr. Rehavam Amir, and his successor, Mr. Shmuel Toledano.

After praising Mr. Amir and noting that Mr. Toledano was a native son who had grown up in an atmosphere in which Jews and Arabs had lived as friends, Mr. Eshkol said: "In my youth I believed that Jews and Arabs would live in peace. I still believe this, despite the temporary disaffection between us."
